I'm gobsmacked! I just went to Prof. Mendelson's site, and I agree that WordPerfect for DOS is absolutely the most awesome program. It's such a shame that Microsoft Word took over. I'm so happy to hear people are still using Composure and that you find it so helpful. I came from an advertising typography background in the pre-PC era, so I wrote Composure mostly for myself to replace what was missing from what I was used to working with.

It feels like it's been six lifetimes since I wrote Composure, and it certainly has not been developed over these decades. I thought when Windows supplanted DOS that it was dead (although I suspect somebody from the Windows development team built on my ideas). I have no earthly idea if there were other iterations of it. At 72, my memory is not what it used to be.

I would be honored to donate Composure for the WPDOS community to freely use. I don't have the ability anymore to remove or negate any registration information, but if you know how to do that, please feel free to do so, or add a note to the effect that it's not necessary if you think it's important. All I would ask is that, if my name remains attached to it, that it not be altered in any way that would be an embarrassment to me or hurt people. (I know you would not do that!) It's been so long since I worked in DOS that I don't have a clue how one would go about protecting the code from nefarious actors...or if it's even possible.

So, anyway, Tim, you've really made me happy. Please let me know if there's anything else you need from me to proceed as you wish.
